## PSALM 51

The fourth of the 7 penitential Psalm (6, 32, 38, 51, 102, 130, 143), the best known and, for those overwhelmed with guilt, sorrow and the consequences of sin, the most touching and comforting. *Background*: 2 Sam. 11-12.

- Verses 1-2 The plea for God's mercy that flows from His steadfast love, not ours! There is no other course that can be taken. We are, by nature, sinful and unclean (Rom. 3:9-12, 20).
  - A.. <u>Sin</u> to miss the mark. Failure to live according to God's absolute standard.
  - B. <u>Transgression</u> to intentionally choose to disobey. Willful sin; doing something we know we shouldn't, or not doing something we know we should. Tell a lie. Run a stop sign.
  - C. <u>Iniquity</u> to continue in a sin without repentance. Pre-meditated choice/crooked behavior (Micah 2:1).
- Verse 3 "...my sin is ever before me." Always on my mind.
- Verse 4 "Against you, you only have I sinned..." Gen. 20:6; 2 Sam. 12:13.
- Verse 5 See Gen 8:21; Eph. 2:3.
- Verse 6 Whoever gives in to sin is a fool. Wisdom is in the secret heart. Ps. 37:30-31.
- Verse 7 Hyssop was used in ceremonial cleansing <u>Lev. 14:1-7</u> (blood); <u>Num. 19:14-19</u> (water).
- Verse 8 <u>2 Sam. 12:13; Rom. 8:1; Eph. 2:4,5</u>.
- Verses 9-13 Ps. 103:10-12; Heb. 10:16-17.
- Verse 14-16 "bloodguiltiness" from taking the life of Uriah.
- Verse 17 Consider 2 Chron. 34:26-27; Is. 57:15.
- Verses 18-19 "then will you delight in right sacrifices..." See Ps. 50:14-15; Heb. 13:15.
