PSALM 16

Verses 1-2 <u>Calling on the LORD for preservation and refuge.</u>

- A. From what? Just the troubles and hard moments of life? That's where a lot of our cries are directed, aren't they?
- B. "Preserve me, O God." In the Hebrew he calls God 'el-"the strong one."
- C. "I say to the <u>LORD</u> 'You are my <u>Lord</u>...' Again we meet with <u>Ex. 3:13-16</u> and <u>Jn. 8:58</u>. Our cry for preservation and refuge draws us to Christ, our preservation and refuge from sin, hopeless death and hell.
- D. "I have no good apart from you." Think about it! Everything you have and do of this world can, will and does change, decay and end!
- E. God's refuge and strength in Word and Sacrament.

Verse 3 "the saints"

- A. Those who the LORD sets apart as His own through the faith He has worked in them.
- B. "in whom is all my delight" one minded with them.

Verse 4 David would have nothing to do with any pagan gods.

- A. "drink offerings of blood" animal or human sacrifices poured out on an altar or the ground. Eg <u>2 Ki. 23:10</u> ("burning place" Topheth); <u>Jer. 7:16-19</u>; 30-31; <u>Is. 57:5.</u>
- B. Look at these: <u>Isaiah 45:5, 6, 18, 21, 22</u>; <u>46:9</u>

Verses 5-6 "The LORD is....

- A. my chosen portion and my cup..."
 - 1. David confesses that the Lord is his portion; more-so then the land of his ancestors which God portioned out to the 12 Tribes. See Jsh. 13-19; 21.
 - 2. "my cup" his drink offering is to the Lord, not to other gods. He will not accept or stand with them!
- B. "a beautiful inheritance." his eternal home! Cf verse 11!
