Despite two double batches of potato salad, none was left. There were a lot of green beans left, but only one kind of soup was left (out of three batches). There was only enough Red Cabbage for Kathy and Sandy to take some home; only 10 Brats were left from the 70 prepared; one-half of one Pork Loins (prepared 4) was left; one quarter of the Apple cake was left over; and only a few pieces of the Pecan Cobbler were left. We had 90 signed up for the originally scheduled day, but only 74 attended on the rescheduled date.
