## PSALM 14

Intro: Psalm 14 turns our attention to the reason for the breakdown of law and order: The universal depravity of man. This Psalm is almost identical with Psalm 53.

## Verses 1-3

- A. See <u>Rom. 3:10-12</u>.
  - 1. Who is the fool? "The children of man." "There is none who does good."
  - 2. Man deliberately silences his conscience.
  - 3. See <u>Jn. 2:23-25</u>. Their faith was fickle. Were looking for a better life on earth.
  - 4. See Mk. 7:21-23.
- B. "The Lord looks down from heaven on the children of man." Gen. 11:5; 18:21; Ps. 33:13-15.
- C. "to see if there are any who understand, who seek after God." Gen 6:5; 8:21; (again, Mk. 7:21-23); Rm. 1:18; Jn. 3:19; Jn. 7:7; Eph. 2:1-3; 2 Tim. 3:5.
- D. And so, "...all turned aside...have become corrupt...there is one who does good, not even one."
- Verse 4 "...eat up my people..." An insatiable appetite to exploit and hurt others without regrets or limits. E.g., <u>Ezek. 22:25-29</u>; <u>Mi.3:1-3.</u>
- Verse 5 "There they are in great terror..." The reality will engulf them. <u>Is. 33:14.</u>
  Though <u>Ps. 143:2</u> is clear, the "poor" who see their sin and are brought to faith are the righteous. <u>Rom. 1:17</u>; <u>Gal. 3:11</u>; <u>Eph. 2:8-9</u>.
- Verse 6 "You would shame..." -see <u>7:14,15</u>. The Lord is our refuge. <u>Ps 46:1, 10 & 11</u>.
- Verse 7 Points to the Messiah. <u>2 Thess. 1:5-10; Heb. 12:22; Rev. 21:1-4.</u>
