Many members are not coming to church due to Covid.


I need to get 2021 offering envelopes to our members.

**UPDATE 11/17/2020** 

Dear Pilgrim Brothers and Sisters,

As many of you know, the Macon County Health Department is asking churches to be virtual at least through January 15 as Covid-19 cases continue to rise. Meanwhile, nothing has changed on the Illinois Department of Public Health website regarding faith-based organizations.

Since June, we have been offering in-person services with the highest possible regard for safety. We have been following the Illinois Department of Health guidelines for faith-based organizations. Also, our members have been incredibly cooperative and have been very careful to abstain from coming to church when they do not feel well. They follow all the rules when they are here. We have not had a known incident where someone with Covid-19 has attended any of our services or classes.

Consequently, we have decided to continue to hold our in-person services and classes unless something indicates that we should do otherwise. So, nothing will change with what we are presently doing.

We will monitor the situation in Macon County and in our own parish. We will, for now, refrain from expanding our in-person opportunities.

For those of you who would like to give thanks to God for his gifts, especially for the forgiveness of sins in the blood of Jesus, we <u>will</u> be offering an <u>online Thanksgiving service</u> in which you will be able to find on our PLC website. <u>We will not be conducting in-person or online Midweek Advent services</u> due to logistics.

Again, everything else will continue as it has since June. To repeat what we have repeatedly said, it is recommended by many public guidelines that people who are older, or who have medical conditions should avoid a congregate setting. You are not sinning against God if you choose not to come, nor will your pastors be hurt or think less of you. Again, there is no reason why you should feel guilty if you choose not to attend. Go with your "gut," while understanding that there are no guarantees in Scripture that church going Christians are immune from catching COVID-19 and dying.

Beloved, we pray that all may go well with you and that you may be in good health, as it goes well with your souls! We send you our love and prayers in Christ, who shed his blood, died, and rose from the dead and ascended into heaven that we might rise and live with him in his eternal kingdom!

"If you forgive anyone his sins, they are forgiven." (John 20:23)

"I forgive you." The three most powerful words in the universe. They don't just change the universe for someone. They change someone's eternity. They change your eternity!

From His Cross, Jesus said, "It is finished" (John 19:30). His once-for-all death is yours, made yours, and is delivered into your ears, your heart, soul, mind, and strength with those three words: "I forgive you." His resurrection from the dead is also yours. Not just yours in your Baptism—once is never enough for Jesus—the forgiveness (justification, innocent verdict) of His resurrection is also made yours through those words: "I forgive you." Jesus delivers through those words all the benefits of His death and resurrection to all who hear and believe them; "He who by grace the Word believes The purchase of His blood receives" (LSB 614:6).

Forgiveness of sins in His Name is everything to Jesus. He sends out pastors to deliver those three eternity-changing words all over the world. He sends your pastor to deliver them to you. If you have sins, even a specific sin, your pastor's there to deliver Jesus' forgiveness for it. It's not just your pastor, either. You, too—yes, you! You were baptized and gifted all the people in your life so that "if your brother sins against you seven times a day and returns to you seven times saying, 'I repent,' you will forgive him" (Luke 17:4).

"I forgive you." Powerful words. Jesus' words. His words for you through "The minister whom Christ has sent" (LSB 614:5). Also His words for others through you. These words won't just change your summer or transform your daily life as a baptized child of God. With these three words, Jesus changes your eternity.
