

The Blessings of 2020 By Penny Weaver

As each year draws to a close, I often take the time to reflect upon our ministry and the ways we have grown, how God has used us, and to pray about how we will expand and strengthen our programming and services in the coming year. As I have thought about 2020, I have been amazed by the many ways our ministry has pivoted to continue reaching our community in new and innovative ways. Because the services offered at New Life Pregnancy Center are considered essential, we were able to put policies and practices in place that have allowed us to remain safely open.

Throughout the pandemic,
New Life has continued
providing pregnancy testing
and limited medical services. Our ministry
team has worked to maintain compliance
with the CDC, Illinois Department of
Public Health, and Macon County Health
Department guidelines and adapted
procedures as guidelines have changed.
For many of our clients, facing a pregnancy
during COVID-19 has come with its own
unique set of fears and concerns. Over
the last year, we have seen an increased
number of women considering abortion.



Our medical staff works individually with each client to address these fears and to encourage making informed, life-giving decisions, as well as supporting and educating our clients as they work through their options. Thankfully, many unborn babies and their mothers were spared the trauma of abortion because of the care and support they received from New Life.

Our front office has embraced the opportunity to bless multiple families in need. Due to limitations on important services previously offered in our community, we had more people calling or stopping in for assistance. Our front office staff viewed this as an opportunity to listen and find ways to help whenever possible. As a result, countless women, men, and children who were new to our ministry were shown the love of Christ and helped in their time of need. Even when we were prohibited from operating like we normally do, our front office was answering phone calls and making porch deliveries of necessary items, like formula and diapers.

B.E.S.T., our program that supports and educates families in our community, has moved the majority of our programming online in an effort to continue serving our families. Clients can now watch and discuss informative videos on pregnancy, parenting, and other relevant topics using BrightCourse. This online learning platform provides a way for us to educate and build relationships, while helping our moms constructively plan for their future. We offer a weekly online Bible study that ensures clients have the opportunity to learn from God's word and continue growing in their faith.



Raising Up Dads, our men's ministry, and B.E.S.T. collaborated to bring a virtual Zoom class on

Healthy Parenting to our clients.

Our attendance online has surpassed our previous in-person attendance.

Shopping in our Blessing Boutique and one-on-one appointments have taken place virtually whenever possible.

Christmas Blessings, our yearly event where clients shop for toys for their children using Care Cash they have earned, was held with safety restrictions in place.



Our Sex Esteem team, normally out in schools teaching on Sexual Risk Avoidance,

found ways to show our appreciation for the teachers that participate in our school program. They sent encouraging emails and delivered care packages to express our gratitude for all that our teachers do. Sex Esteem is now creating short, informative videos of our education team presenting on the topics they normally teach in classrooms.

A different video is sent weekly to participating teachers with discussion questions they can use to address each topic.
