WANTED:

Many of you know that Razjada Brown has been in the hospital since September in Maryland Heights, MO. The hospital and insurance company want to send her to a group home (where we can't visit) or a nursing home in order to get her out of the hospital. They have decreased her Physical Therapy saying this is the best she will ever be, confined to a wheelchair. We know that's not true. She wants to walk again. We need to bring her home to provide the chance to increase her strength and to be around family, friends and our Pilgrim family.

She misses her church deeply and appreciates the many letters, cards and gifts.

We are in the process of doing home modifications on a home in Maroa and we are looking for items for her for the near future once she is home. Please let Kay Tolly (217-358-4401) know if you know anyone who may be selling the following items:

- 1. Hoyer Lift
- 2. Stair Lift (curved) not needed at this time but future
- 3. Wheelchair van (prefer automatic locking for wheelchair, low miles) Ford Transit wheelchair van with windows or a Dodge Promaster wheelchair van with windows. We could possibly consider a regular wheelchair van with the automatic locks depending on how much room is inside for 5 of us including the wheelchair.
- 4. Power wheelchair

We will also need a few volunteers who would be willing to help keep her active at home until the restrictions lift at Macon Resources where she will attend the day program. Volunteers would do such things as playing board games, cards, doing puzzles, some simple school activities, sewing, simple food prep, arts and crafts, music or just sitting and visiting. Any type of activity that the volunteer would enjoy. High School students can also get service hours for graduation.

We are also looking for a couple of paid Personal Support Workers that help with personal care and/or sitting with her when the family isn't home. This is a paid position that requires Criminal Background check and is paid through the state for a certain number of hours a month for assistance with her care.
