Why Higher Things conferences?

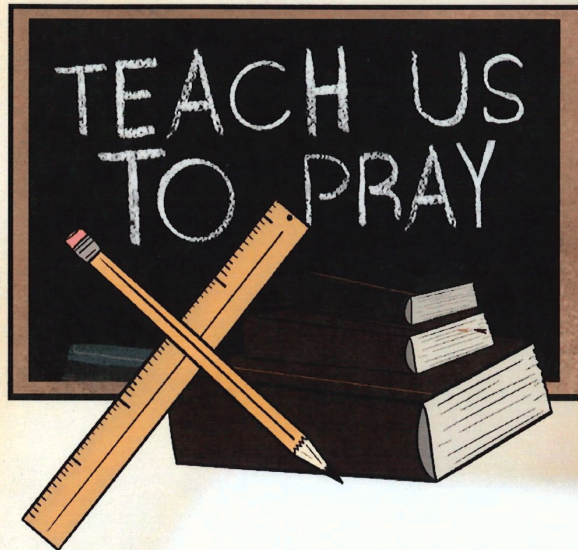

As always, we will have snack time, music, recreation and crafts.

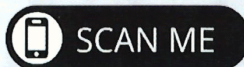
